

1 We use *at* for times and certain expressions.

at 8.00

at midnight

at lunchtime

at the weekend

at Christmas

at the moment

2 We use *on* for days and dates.

on Friday

on Friday morning

on 12th September

on Saturday evening

3 We use *in* for longer periods such as months, seasons, and years.

in April

in 2002

in summer

in the nineteenth century

4 We also use *in* for parts of the day.

in the morning

in the afternoon

in the evening (but **at** night)

5 There is no preposition before *last*, *next*, *this*, or *tomorrow*.

Did you go out **last** night?

We're going away **this** weekend.

I'll see you **next** week.

Can you call me **tomorrow** morning?
